The work we do in 2020 will be based on our three focus areas:

**BUILD, PROMOTE, DEFEND.**

# What we will focus on and do to achieve our Strategic Goals

## **BUILD** the Internet

- **EXTEND THE INTERNET TO COMMUNITIES THAT DO NOT HAVE IT AND NEED IT MOST**

## **PROMOTE** the Internet

- **PROMOTE THE INTERNET MODEL OF NETWORKING AS THE PREFERRED MODEL**
- **CONVINCE KEY GOVERNMENTS OF THE WORLD TO ADOPT POLICIES THAT FAVOR THE INTERNET MODEL AND IMPROVE INTERNET CONNECTIVITY**
- **PROMOTE THE DEPLOYMENT OF TECHNOLOGIES AND PROTOCOLS THAT SECURE THE INTERCONNECTION OF INDEPENDENT NETWORKS**

## **DEFEND** the Internet

- **SHAPE THE POLICIES OF KEY GOVERNMENTS IN FAVOR OF THE GROWTH OF INDEPENDENT NETWORKS, WHICH ARE FREE TO INTERCONNECT**



- **COUNTER ATTEMPTS BY KEY GOVERNMENTS TO UNDERMINE ENCRYPTION**
- **DEFEND AGAINST SHUTDOWNS BY INCREASING CROSS-BORDER CONNECTIVITY AND**

## An overriding focus on projects

By positioning the Internet Society as the place where 'stuff gets done' for the Internet, we will

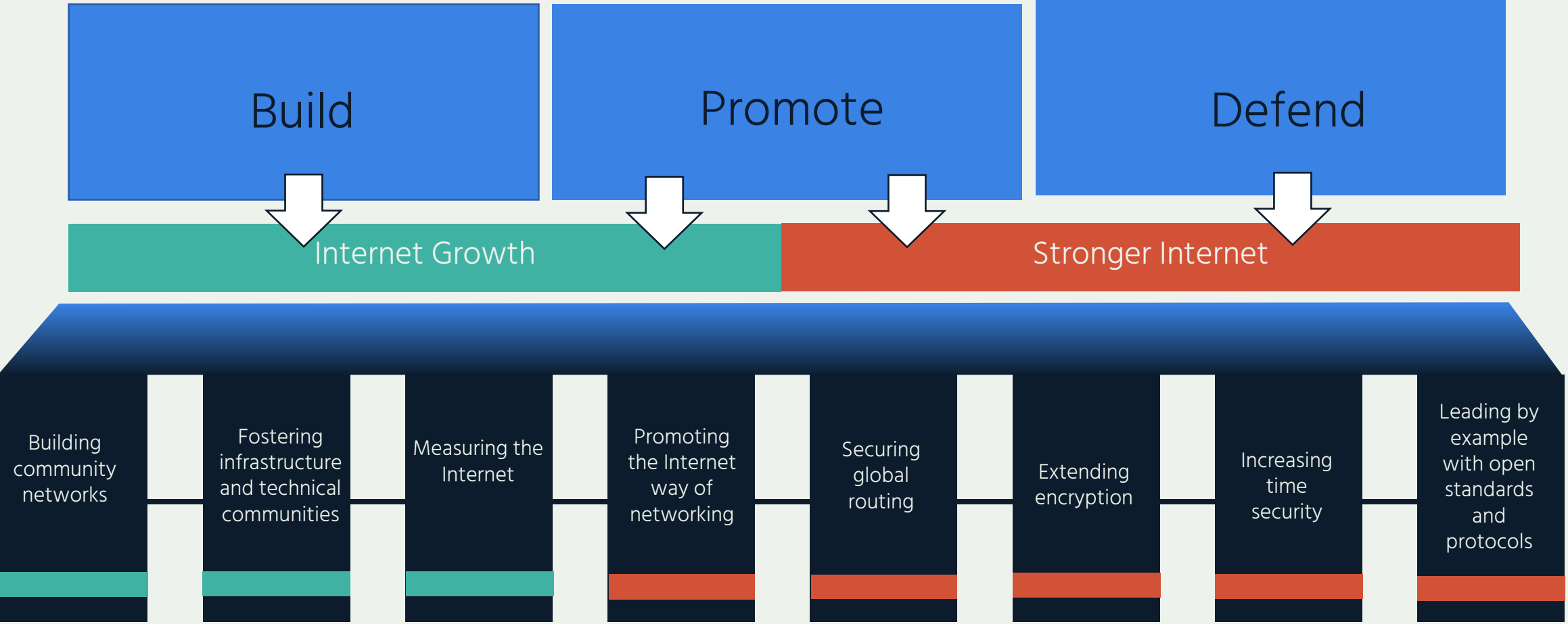
- inspire others to join our cause and catalyze a movement

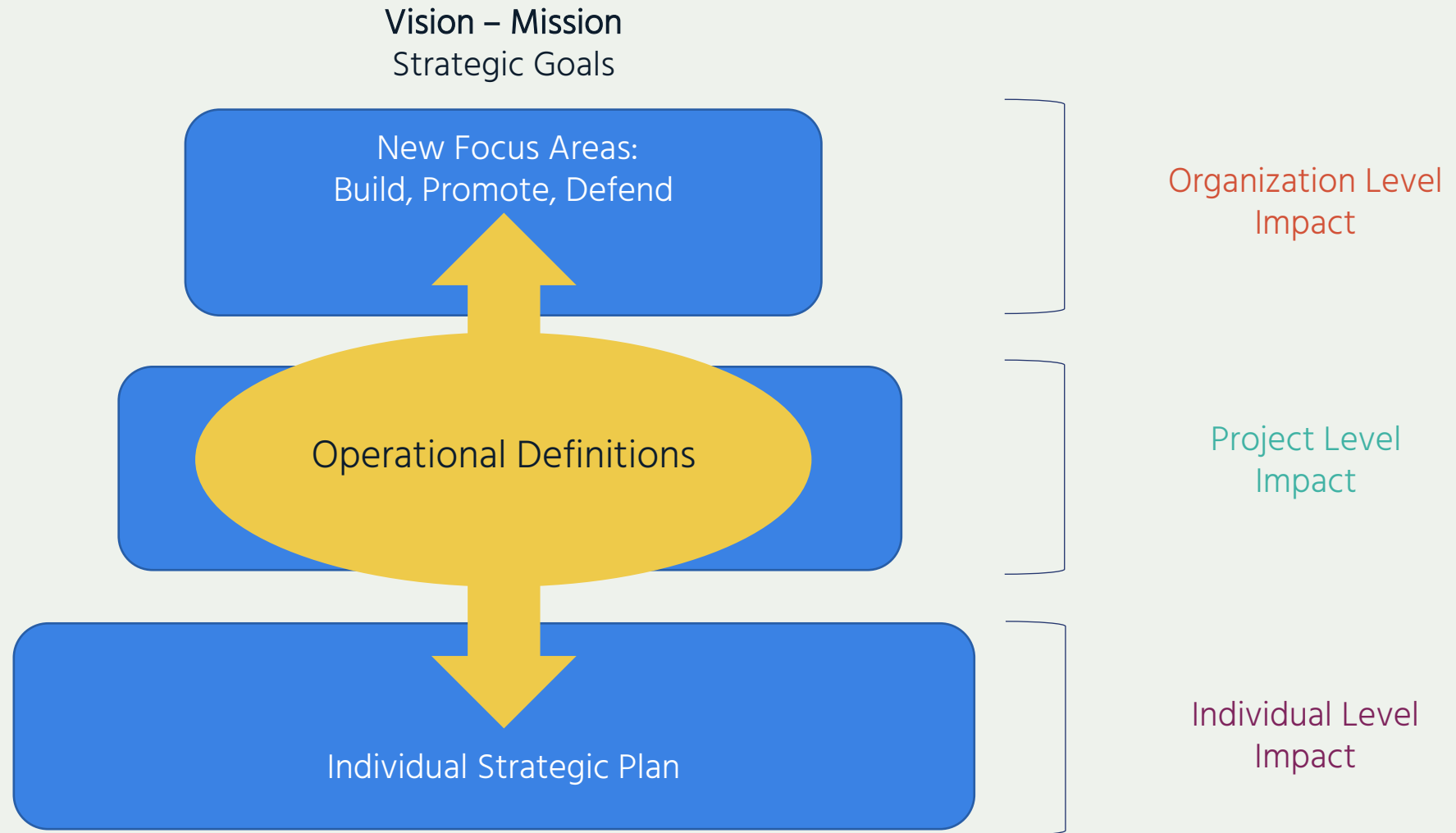

# Extending encryption

Addressing the threat to encrypted communications posed by both governments and private sector

Outcomes of our work in 2020:

- Develop of a narrative that advances end-to-end encryption against threats such as exceptional access
- Create a diverse and engaged global network of coalitions, with aligned participants

- Support creation of five new IXPs and strengthen 10 in existence to support local Internet growth
- Training in key geographies
- Sow the seeds for self-sustaining communities

- maximizing the effectiveness of our project-led efforts.

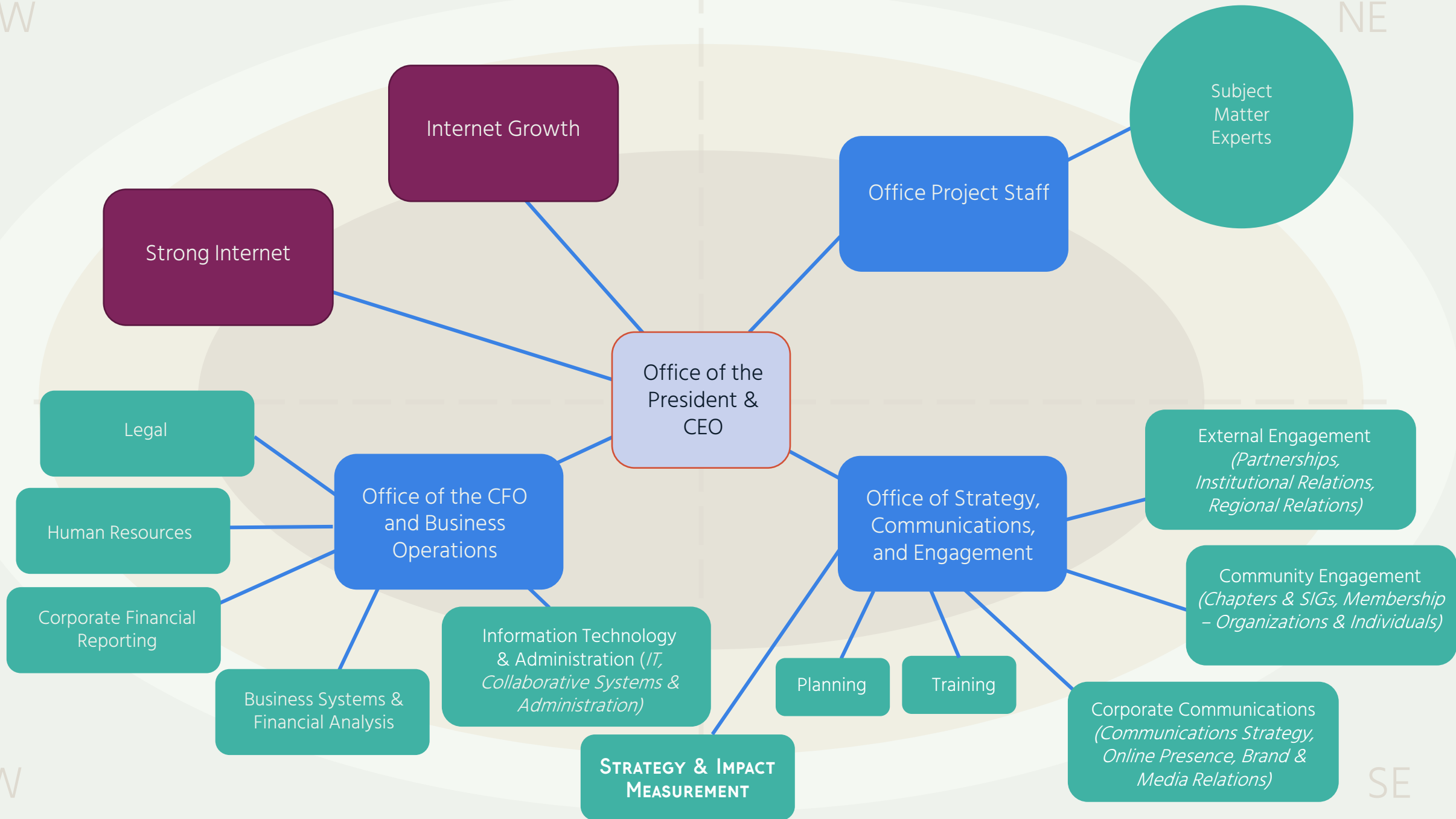
